Part 1. Health certificate.

The health certificate must not be issued earlier than 48 hours before the journey to the Faroe Islands starts.

The undersigned authorised veterinarian has this day done a careful clinical examination of the above mentioned dog,

Part 2. Certificate for treatment against parasites.

The dog must be treated against parasites mentioned below. The treatment against ecto- and endoparasites must be done with drugs effective against mange mites and Echinococcus granulosus and E. multilocularis. The treatment must not be finished earlier than 1 week before the arrival of the dog to the Faroe Islands.

Part 3. Vaccination Certificate.

Valid vaccinations must not be more than 1 year old and must not be performed later than 1 month before the arrival of the dog to the Faroe Islands.

A puppy has to be 12 weeks old, before it is vaccinated and then has to wait 1 month before entering the Faroe Islands.

Original vaccination certificates are to be enclosed.

The undersigned authorised veterinarian certifies that the above mentioned dog has been vaccinated *lege artis* against canine diseases as follows not later than 1 month nor longer than 1 year before the journey to Faroe Islands starts:
