Part 1. Health certificate

The health certificate must not be issued earlier than 48 hours before the journey to the Faroe Islands starts.

The undersigned authorized veterinarian has this day done a careful clinical examination of the above-mentioned cat. By the examination the cat was found healthy and in good condition without any clinical signs of infectious diseases.

Part 2. Certificate for treatment against parasites

The cat must be treated against the parasites mentioned below. The treatment against ecto- and endoparasites must be done with drugs effective against mange mites and *Echinococcus granulosus* and *E. multilocularis*. The treatment must not be finished earlier than 1 week before the arrival of the cat to the Faroe Islands.

Part 3. Vaccination Certificate

Valid vaccinations must not be more than 1 year old and must not be performed later than 4 weeks before the arrival of the cat to the Faroe Islands.

Kittens have to be 12 weeks old, before they are vaccinated and then have to wait 4 weeks before entering the Faroe Islands.

The undersigned authorized veterinarian certifies that the above mentioned cat has been vaccinated *lege artis* against feline diseases as follows not later than 4 weeks nor longer than 1 year before the journey to the Faroe Islands starts:

Part 4. Certificate by the Official Veterinarian
